



PLANTAGENET CITY AND THE GALLO-ROMAN WALL OF LE MANS

7





Almost two millennia of history separate the origins of the Roman Wall from the Le Mans 24 Hours. The Sarthe enjoyed great influence during mediaeval times and a history of innovation during the 19th and 20th centuries leaving it with a very rich legacy.

The Plantagenet dynasty left its mark on the Sarthe department. Walk in the footsteps of this French-English dynasty as you discover the old historic centre of Le Mans called Plantagenet City and the castle of Montmirail, the scene of an important historic encounter.

PLANTAGENET CITY : A PLUNGE INTO THE PAST

The size and beautiful design of the historic centre of Le Mans will fill you with awe. It stretches out over an area of 37 acres and boasts around one hundred half-timbered houses, the oldest of which date back to the 15th century. Several sculpted pillars and engraved lintels tell the story of the town's trading activity and confirm certain legends. The Cathedral of Saint-Julian, whose bell tower stands out against the skyline like a lighthouse is the perfect example of the era that spanned the Romanesque and Gothic architectural styles. It is home to two particularly beautiful treasures: a magnificent chapel decorated with 47 painted angel musicians and the 12th century stained glass window depicting the Ascension - the oldest stained glass window in the world still in place in a cathedral.

SPOTLIGHT ON...

The 12th century enamel plaque of Geoffroy Plantagenet is one of the most beautiful examples of its kind. Geoffrey Plantagenet was the founder of the dynasty and here you can see him dressed in ceremonial costume with sword and shield. The exceptional colours were much admired at its first showing in New York, after which they travelled to the Louvre Abu Dhabi in 2020 for an exhibition dedicated to enamels. You can see it at the Musée Carré Plantagenêt in Le Mans.

ROYAL EPAU ABBE, THE ABBEY OF QUEEN BERENGARIA

In 1229, Berengaria of Navarre, wife of Richard the Lionheart, decided to found a large Cistercian abbey - the Royal Epau Abbey. The Gothic architecture of the building was designed to ensure that the values of the order, namely austerity and simplicity, were observed to the letter. The abbey, which was taken over by the Department of the Sarthe in 1958, is now one of the most important cultural centres in the Sarthe. Each year, a major exhibition is held in the abbey (Anima (Ex) Musica in 2021 - 2022), a photographic exhibition in the gardens (Vincent Munier, Hans-Sylvestre, Robert Doisneau...), music festivals (classical, jazz and contemporary) and son et lumière shows at the end of the year.

Anima (Ex) Musica (until 13 March) is an exhibition of XXL woodlice, beetles, spiders and other small animals made out of old musical instruments. 12 different species are mechanically animated and accompanied by some strange sound effects!

PERMACULTURE GARDEN : REINSTATING THE ABBEY'S MISSION OF PRODUCING FOOD

The Royal Epau Abbey is committed to its Cistercian heritage. In 2019, a vegetable garden was built in the form of the rose window and the lancet arches of the choir of the abbey. Like the former Cistercian monks who were self-supporting, the aim is to be able to supply 100% of the vegetables for the estate's consumption. The choice of permaculture was obvious thus bringing the site into the 21st century. Transmission is the key word at the heart of the project and a wide range events and workshops are organised to this end for visitors and schools.

CHÂTEAU DE MONTMIRAIL AT THE HEART OF A HISTORIC ENCOUNTER

In 1169, the King of England, Henry II Plantagenet, accompanied by two of his sons, Richard the Lionheart and John Lackland, met the King of France, Louis VII the Younger, and the Archbishop of Canterbury, Thomas Beckett in the grounds of the Château de Montmirail. The reason: to reconcile Thomas Beckett with Henry II. The attempt failed and the archbishop was murdered less than a year later by knights close to the King of England!

A CASTLE WITH ACTIVITIES ALL YEAR ROUND

The castle with its medieval foundations was rebuilt in the 15th century and is open all year round.

It has five comfortable and attractive guest rooms. It is open during the day for visits and puts on a large number of (picnic) concerts in the gardens in the summer. It also has a shop dedicated to local producers and arts and crafts revealing the local skills and specialities. The restored stables house a tea room, reception and seminar rooms.

THE ASTELLE MONTMIRAIL : HISTORIC KNIVES !

The Astelle Montmirail workshop came about following an encounter between Pascal Turpin, one of the last edge-tool makers in France, and the Herbelin family, owners of the castle. The "Astelle Montmirail" workshop produces handcrafted knives, some of which are made using wood from the castle's old beams. The workshop even offers classes so that you can produce your own knives.







Built between the 3rd and 4th centuries, this city walls more than one kilometre long, protected the ancient city of Vindinum, capital of the Gallic people of the Aulerci Cenoman tribe. Today, 500 metres of polychrome walls with geometric patterns remain in place, interspersed with 11 towers and 3 posterns. The walls of Le Mans share the description best preserved walls in the entire ancient Roman Empire with the two imperial capitals of Rome and Constantinople (Istanbul).

A PRESTIGIOUS CITY WALL

The predominantly red city wall that is visible from the river, was designed to impress and thus demonstrate the might and wealth of the city. The refined motifs (rhombus, triangle and hourglass) and the quality of the structure with alternating layers of brick, rows of pale limestone and dark russet sandstone held together with pink-coloured mortar - reinforce this hypothesis.

🕈 SPOTLIGHT ON....

The Carré Plantagenêt Museum. The archaeology museum of Le Mans will be holding a major exhibition that looks back at the history of the city wall featuring an immersive 3D experience and interactive media. Opens 14 May 2022.

? Did you know ?

The city of Le Mans has applied for the Gallo-Roman wall to appear in UNESCO World Heritage listing.



LES PETITES CITÉS DE CARACTÈRE

The "Petites Cités de Caractère" brand promotes atypical, rural and dynamic towns with a rich and preserved heritage. Here are the principal attractions you will find there.

Asnières-sur-Vègre

The Manoir de la Cour (13th century), the murals of the Saint-Hilaire church (11th and 12th centuries) and the artists' studios.

Brûlon

The Haussmannian quarter, the Pissot tower and the Claude Chappe museum (inventor of the semaphore and native of Brûlon).

Fresnay-sur-Sarthe (2nd in the Most Beautiful Villages of France)

The Hairdressing Museum, the remains of the castle and its ramparts, the Creusot districts and the weavers' houses.

Luché-Pringé

The Mervé fortified mill, the churches of Saint-Martin de Luché and Notre-Dame de Pringé and the Priory of Saint-Martin.

Le Lude

The castle and its gardens, the 16th century architects' house and the Recollets Convent

Mamers 2

The Italian-style theatre, the covered market, the church of Saint-Nicolas and the former Convent of the Visitation.

Montmirail

The castle, the church of Notre-Dame de l'Assomption, the fortifications and the Saint-Servais Chapel.

Parcé-sur-Sarthe

The Saint-Pierre tower, the former stables, the houses with turrets and the mill.

Saint-Calais

The Corn Exchange, the banks of the Anille River, the wash houses, the gazebos and the museum-library.

Saint-Léonard-des-Bois

The listed site of the Alpes Mancelles, the slate quarries, the leisure centre, the Domaine du Gasseau.

Sillé-le-Guillaume

The castle, Sillé beach, the forest and its protected natural site, the canonry and art deco houses.

SPOTLIGHT ON...




The frescoes of Asnières-sur-Vègre. The church of Saint-Hilaire in this village is home to some impressive frescoes that date back to the 12th and 13th centuries. One of them, representing hell, is quite scary. Another, depicting the Adoration of the Magi with Virgin and Child, is incredibly well preserved.











A LOIRE CHÂTEAU IN THE SARTHE : THE CHÂTEAU DU LUDE

A great number of important figures in French history have stayed here, including Henri IV, Louis XIII and the Marquise de Sevigné. The Middle Ages comes together here with the Renaissance and the 19th century. Surprises await you when you cross the threshold: the remarkable studiolo adorned with extraordinary 16th century wall paintings and the collection of ceremonial costumes from the era of Louis XVI in the main gallery.

The castle, which is still inhabited, buzzes with activity all year round: workshops in the medieval kitchens, escape games in the era of Jules Verne or the Musketeers, the 'Fête des Jardiniers', etc.

SPOTLIGHT ON...

A forgotten studiolo. The 16th century studiolo had remained hidden behind plasterwork and a false ceiling until its discovery in 1850! Every surface of the studiolo had been painted and it was a room reserved for meditation or spiritual study. The decorative paintings depict biblical scenes and allegories from Petrarch's Triumphs. This type of room is a rarity in French castles.









REMARKABLE GARDENS

The garden of the Prieuré de Vauboin in Beau-

mont-sur-Dême is an ode to boxwood. The gardener, who is passionate about boxwood, sculpts, models and prunes it every day until it the characters almost come to life.

The jardin du Petit Bordeaux in Saint-Biez-

en-Belin is an intimate garden with over 4,000 species and varieties of trees, shrubs, old roses, grasses and perennials.

The garden of château du Lude is a formal garden with a vegetable garden against the backdrop of the River Loir flowing languidly by.

The garden of the Château de Villaines in

Louplandes is a walled kitchen garden featuring a classical section with a symmetrical layout.

The garden of the Château du Mirail in

Crannes-en-Champagne is a combination of French and English traditional styles.

The garden of the Donjon de Ballon is inspired by

medieval and renaissance gardens with impressive walls of roses and a mysterious alley of lime trees.

The Renaissance garden of the Château de

Poncé-sur-le-Loir looks like a theatre set nestling at the foot of a limestone cliff.

PIACÉ-LE-RADIEUX BÉZARD - LE CORBUSIER, A DIALOGUE BETWEEN ARCHITEC-TURE AND NATURE

Piacé was at the heart of the utopian La Ferme Radieuse project designed to enhance rural districts and initiated in the 1930s by Le Corbusier and Norbert Bézard. A permanent exhibition in the art centre revisits this venture and includes a tour of contemporary art, design and architecture consisting thirty works installed throughout the village.

RENÉ, THE VILLAGE OF ARTS AND ARTISTS

This small village of 300 souls has dedicated itself entirely to art. Dozens of frescoes, graffiti and sculptures (Titi from Paris, Thérèse Launay, Pierre Zanni (sculptor), La Rouille, Jorge Castronovo) are dotted throughout the village and adorn street corners, lurk behind gates or at the foot of the church. Every first Sunday of October, the "resident-artists" invite about 30 artists from all over France to come and exhibit in the village during the Pictoires.

LA RICHARDIÈRE : SILENCE FOR THE ARTISTS

This former wine-producing farm that nestles in the hollow of a valley, welcomes painters and poets in search of inspiration or a moment of tranquillity. The estate is made up of three studios/bedrooms and a small house. The décor is minimalist and modern allowing artists a blank space in which their creativity can blossom.

EXCEPTIONAL AND PROTECTED NATURE

The Sarthe department protects its different areas of natural beauty. 15 sites are listed as Sensitive Natural Areas (ENS in French) and come under the permanent management and 1Z are Natura 2000 listed sites. The Sensitive Natural Areas allow the observation of fauna and flora of various ecosystems (marshes, peat bogs, hedged farmland, lakes, limestone slopes, forests, etc.). Otters, yellow-bellied toads, peregrine falcons and plum pox beetles are among the species that can be discovered in the Sarthe.

The Bercé forest is a veritable treasure of the Sarthe region and is reputed to have one of the most beautiful collections of centuries-old oaks in France.

THE OAKS, KINGS OF BERCÉ

The forest is home to several oak groves, including the Futaie des Clos, one of the most beautiful in France. Covering 8 hectares, it contains hundreds of oak trees whose average age is over 300 years and that are as tall as 50 metres. The Boppe oak, for example, known as the King of Bercé, is 44 metres tall.

THE OAKS OF THE SARTHE TO THE RESCUE OF NOTRE-DAME DE PARIS

The know-how of successive generations of foresters has enabled these trees to develop straight, slender trunks. This quality has made the reputation of Bercé. Previously used for shipbuilding, the large oaks are now sought after for barrel-making. Eight exceptional oaks were even selected for the reconstruction of the spire of Notre-Dame Cathedral in Paris.





A FOREST WITH WALKS TO TAKE YOUR BREATH AWAY

Bercé Forest is a natural cathedral where the trunks and crowns create the impression of pillars and vaults making it a wonderful place for walking, observing nature and simple contemplation.

The ruddy forest paths are connected at junctions, departure points for hikers, horse riders and cyclists. Towards the end of the summer, the echo of the stag's bellow can be heard in the undergrowth. At the edge of the forest at Carnuta, la Maison de l'Homme et de la Forêt with its entertaining and interactive museography teaches visitors about the forest ecosystem and the professions related to wood cutting.

Les Alpes Mancelles. des montagnes à 2 h de Paris!

The Alpes Mancelles are remnants of the Armorican Massif in the heart of the Normandy-Maine Regional Nature Park. The unique screes of Saint-Léonard-des-Bois and the steep hills and forests form a unique landscape. The Sarthe River that winds its way between the rocky outlines of sandstone and granite, unveils a fascinating heritage of mills and locks.

SAINT-LÉONARD-DES-BOIS, SPORT AND NATURE

A central location in the Alpes Mancelles, 'Saint-Léo ' is the starting point for a wide range of hikes that lead to the tops of the two steep hills that enclose it on both sides. The Domaine du Gasseau, the village's leisure centre offers activities such as horse-riding, canoeing, climbing and tree-top adventures.





FRESNAY-SUR-SARTHE, VOTED SECOND MOST BEAUTIFUL VILLAGE BY FRENCH PEOPLE IN 2021

Perched on a rocky outcrop, this medieval town grew considerably thanks to its textile industry. Fresnay was renowned for its very fine cloth. The weavers' district on the banks of the Sarthe is now a delight for walkers. The narrow streets, the remains of the castle destroyed during the Hundred Years' War and the listed church in roussard stone make Fresnay one of the most beautiful villages in the Sarthe.

nal National Park has applied for the UNESCO Global Geopark Label. The geological formation of the scree that is typical of the Alpes Mancelles is a strong argument for this application.



Screes. The screes made up of sharp edged sandstone scree from the Amorican Massif, were formed during the Ice Age 2.6 million years ago. The alternating freezing and thawing during this era caused the rock to break up.



PAINTERS OF THE ALPES MANCELLES

In the 19th century, landscape painting was in vogue. Painters, looking for natural forms to paint, found inspiration in the landscape, fauna and flora of the Alpes Mancelles. Being so close to Paris it soon became very fashionable!

THE WESTERN RIVERS, NEW PATHS TO FREEDOM.

The Sarthe, Maine-et-Loire and Mayenne joined forces to create the leading river destination in the west of the country. With 283 km of navigable waterways, it is the largest navigable basin west of Paris and the largest network of navigable rivers in France! It is very popular for the tranquillity and wealth of landscapes traversed by the rivers. They have retained all their natural charm, transporting travellers and strollers through a remarkable world of natural beauty and historical heritage.






Micro-adventures in the San

THE SARTHE, CROSS-COUNTRY TRAIL TERRITORY!



Accompanied by Nathalie Mauclair, double world champion in the discipline in 2013 and 2015, the Sarthe department has created a crosscountry trail station, the first of its kind in France.

The champion, who set up the trails herself, describes them as "varied and easy to run. You will certainly be surprised by the nature along the trails as well as the wildlife".

The Sarthe cross-country trail station boasts two trails:

Le bocage du Narais - 20 km - medium difficulty, Le Loudon - 40 km - rather difficult.

Other stations supported by the Department will soon open in the Alpes Mancelles, the forests of Sillé-le-Guillaume and Bercé and in La Ferté-Bernard.

WHAT IS A CROSS-COUNTRY TRAIL RESORT?

Like ski resorts, the trail resorts offer a series of marked and protected trails, with different levels of difficulty depending on the distance and the difference in altitude. As with skiing, the levels of difficulty are indicated by a colour code: green, blue, red and black.

THE SARTHE ON FOOT!

Forest paths, sunken paths, towpaths... the Sarthe is criss-crossed by 7 GR and 3,600 km of hiking trails. Thanks to this very dense network, it is possible to discover all of the Sarthe on foot! The variety of natural environments in the Sarthe promises beautiful walks.



La Vallée de la Misère to Saint-Léonard-des-Bois

Circuit from Roche Brune to Sillé-le-Guillaume 13,5 km - Easy. Rocky promontories in the heart of the forest.

LA VÉLOBUISSONNIÈRE, 250 KM OF ESCAPADES AMID NATURE AND LOCAL HERITAGE

Inaugurated at the end of 2020, La Vélobuissonnière will appeal to cycling tourists. Starting in Alençon, which is renowned for its lace and also a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the route is centred mainly in the Sarthe. It crosses the Alpes Mancelles, which has applied for the UNESCO Geopark label, and Le Mans with its Gallo-Roman wall that is unique in the world, before coming to a beautiful end at Saumur in the Loire Valley, also a UNESCO World Heritage Site!

This 130-km bike trail will take you along picturesque villages, across fields, from the Alpes Mancelles to the Perseigne national forest, the highest point of the Sarthe!

LA RONDE DES VALLÉES ET FORÊTS - 185 KM

As you cycle along the forest-covered hills and valleys, you will discover some of the most emblematic natural and cultural sites of the Sarthe! After departing from the cathedral of Le Mans, you head for the south of the Sarthe taking in the Bercé forest, the tuffeau houses and the magnificent 19th century Railway Roundhouse.

MORE GREEN ROUTES IN THE SARTHE


The Sarthe department continues to extend its slow travel itineraries with the construction of four new green routes between 2022 and 2024: from Montval-sur-Loir to Bessé-sur-Braye (33 km) with a link to Saint-Calais (10km) from 2022. This will be followed by two other green routes from La Flèche to La Suze-sur-Sarthe (29km) and from Fresnay-sur-Sarthe to Sillé-le-Guillaume (19km).

SARTHE BIKE TOUR, IN SEARCH OF THE HIDDEN TREASURES OF THE SARTHE ! 14 & 15 MAY 2022








JASNIÈRES AND CÔTEAUX-DU-LOIR, WONDERFUL WINES TO DISCOVER!

REGIONAL SARTHE SPECIALITIES



We start with Gwenaël Lhuissier, the breeder of the Poule Noire du Mans. This chicken that appeared in certain cooking treatises as long ago as 1550 (it even has its own Fable de la Fontaine: Le

Faucon et le Chapon!), disappeared after the war. It took Gwenaël almost 10 years to recover the original quality of the Poule Noire du Mans.

Then we have Jasnières wine, which adorned on the table of Henri IV back in the 16th century; Sarthe rillettes that was brought to the masses at the end of the 19th century by pork butchers from Connerré on the Paris-Brest railway line.

And why buckwheat and Jerusalem artichokes? "Buckwheat is used to feed the hens on the farm and an increasing number of producers are now farming this cereal in the Sarthe" explains the farmer. "Jerusalem artichokes, which were derided for a long time after WWII, were used to feed the local pigs, the Cénomans. And what about watercress? "The 'poulards' or fattened hens were traditionally presented on a bed of watercress" concludes Gwenaël.

The result is the Seven Wonder of the Sarthe, which can be sampled already at the Le Ricordeau restaurant in Loué and will soon be on the menus of other premium restaurants in the Sarthe region.

Sarthe rillettes that are made with pork cooked in fat for a long time at a low temperature and seasoned with salt and pepper are deliciously melting and tasty.

Every year rillettes are given place of honour in Sarthe during the Printemps des Rillettes. From 19 to 27 March this year.

La Poularde du Patis is the creation of the Pascal Cosnet family, poultry breeders in Coulans-sur-Gée. 5,000 to 6,000 poulardes (fattened hens) and guinea fowl are bred all year round on his farm. These fattened hens appear on the tables of two great chefs: Alain Passard (l'Arpège in Paris) and Olivier Boussard (Le Beaulieu in Le Mans). The hens are fed with corn and wheat grown on the farm in an integrated agricultural process, mixed with a cocktail of bramble, nettle, dandelion, horsetail... in all, some 25 wild plants harvested from certified organic sites.

It is impossible to describe the Sarthe without mentioning the legendary 24 Hours of Le Mans race, which attracts more than 260,000 spectators every year. Visitors will see major changes to this legendary race this year.

A NEW CATEGORY: LE MANS HYPERCAR (LMH)

The premier class, LMP1 (Le Mans Prototype 1), will gradually give way to the Hypercar class (LMH). The aim is to attract new manufacturers with cars that are less expensive to produce but that are just as impressive: Alpine (from 2021), Peugeot (in 2022 or 2023) Audi and Porsche (in 2023) have already announced their return! Other manufacturers are also considering the possibility of joining the new category in the years ahead: Ferrari, McLaren and Lamborghini.

2025 : TARGET – ZERO GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS!

The objective of the 24H Mission launched by the Automobile Club de l'Ouest is to create a 100% clean car that emits only water. A first LMPH2G was produced to this end in 2020 and boasts some interesting performances: 0 to 100 km/h in 3.4 seconds and a top speed of over 300 km/h! It is currently still in development but should appear in its maiden 24 Hours of Le Mans in 2025.

This car represents the future of motor racing: competition with zero greenhouse gas emissions.
